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Editorial

RALPH WALDO EMERSON HAD once said, “Nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm.” Our almost four decade long journey, despite facing numerous obstacles on the path, never stopped because we were enthused to bring a meaningful transformation in the otherwise sterile society, which was limping aimlessly ever since the independence of India.

As Al-Ameen Mission grew from strength to strength, the transformation in the Muslim society also took place albeit slowly. Al-Ameen represented as a symbol of change.

We can humbly say that the Mission began the movement leading from the front and brought a transformational change, which is palpably felt now. Over the years, the Mission has built up its reputation through outstanding results. It is the mainstay for all of its activities. This year too, there is no exception.

The NEET result has particularly broken the previous records of the Mission. This is for the first time students from Al-Ameen have crossed the 700 marks. Not one or two students but nine students have scored more than 700 marks out of 720. There are 711 students above 600 marks. Among them there are 541 boys and 170 girls. The rate of successful students has also increased phenomenally.

The Madhyamik (10th std.) as well as Higher Secondary (12th std.) results too have been satisfactory. In Madhyamik last year we had nine students who were in the merit list of 20; this figure has increased to 14 students this time. Students securing 90% marks have also increased than previous year. 427 students have achieved this number. It was 409 students last year.

In Higher Secondary result, we have two students who have got into the state merit list of 10. Md. Sahid from Nayabaz campus has ranked 7th securing 98% marks, while Toufik Mamud from Khalatpur campus has ranked 8th. Both of these meritorious students have also cleared JEE (Main & Advance) and NEET as well. In the state-wise 20 rank as many as 21 students are there from Al-Ameen Mission.

Overall, our boys and girls are sailing quite well. Al-Ameen Mission would continue to do what it does best for the last four decades – finding out the talents from every nook and cranny of Bengal and nurturing them to lead successful lives in future.

The reputation of Al-Ameen Mission among people is because of its outstanding results. In Madhyamik, Higher Secondary, Medicine as well as Engineering – the Mission produce phenomenal results each year. This feature has put this institution in an exceptional position. It is also to be noted that the result of the Medical entrance take the lion share of this reputation. Doubtless, Medical doctor is a profession which is much sought after across different walks of the society.



Reaching the Top

Now, if we glance at the statistics, we would see that each year the number of candidates sitting for medical entrance is increasing and this is an all India feature. According to National Testing Agency (NTA), which conducts the NEET, in 2021, the numbers of candidates were 16 lakh, in 2022 it rose to more than 17 lakh; in 2023 the number increased significantly to 20 lakh 38 thousand. This year the number is 23 lakh 33 thousand 297 candidates. So the demand is not only confined to the Muslim population of West Bengal, it is definitely a pan Indian trend. In West Bengal, one of the positive sides is that many poor Muslim families are able to send their children to become doctors through the entrance examination. Al-Ameen Mission is becoming a catalyst in this respect.

Following are nutshells of some achievers of NEET (UG) 2024

Breaking all the records of the past, the result of Al-Ameen Mission has been unprecedented this year. We write this word at regular interval. But truly, it is the way through which things happens in the Mission. In 2021, 408 candidates from the Mission got 550 marks or more. In 2022, it increased to 550 candidates; in 2023 it increased further to 627. But 2024 is an exception. This is for the first time students from Al-Ameen have crossed the 700 marks. In 2021, the highest mark from the Mission was scored by Towhid Murshid. He got 690 marks and ranked

472. This year, out of 720 marks, nine students have got more than 700 marks. Numbers of successful students have also increased. Above 600 marks there are 711 students. There is another record happened this time. This year 51 students have got more than 600 marks as running candidates.

Out of 720 marks, 711 students have got more than 600 marks – 541 boys and 170 girls. 605 students have got more than 610 marks while 479 students have got more than 620 marks. Out of these 711 students, there are 216 from Murshidabad and 116 from Malda. From the Mission, the highest mark has been scored by Md. Mudassir Rahaman. Out of 720 marks, he has scored 710 marks. His All India Rank is 158. So far, this is the highest marks anyone has achieved from the Mission. He took the NEET coaching from the Khalisani branch. He is from Kankram village under Suti police station of Murshidabad.

The second highest ranker is Md. Aftabuddin Sk. He also got 710 marks out of 720 marks. His All India Rank is 238. Aftabuddin has been studying in the Mission from class VII. Till the Madhyamik examination he had studied in the Hariharpara branch. In 2020, he secured 93% marks in the Madhyamik. Then he moved to the Uluberia branch and in 2022 he scored 86% marks in the H.S. After that he took NEET coaching in the Khalatpur campus. Last year he got 505 marks in the NEET. After that he again worked hard and reached the pinnacle of success. Aftabuddin comes from Indrani, a village under Khargram police station of Murshidabad. His Higher Secondary passed father happened to be a bus conductor. Since he has grown old, he cannot work. His mother Nurjahan Bibi is Madhyamik passed and is a homemaker. Besides Aftabuddin, they have one more son and a daughter. They are also alumni of the Mission.



Aftab's elder sister Summa Khatun, presently, is doing post-graduation in English from Viswabharati University. She had studied in the Belpukur campus from class VII. His elder brother Md. Nizamuddin is studying graduation course in Nursing. He had studied in the Mission from class IX. Aftab's parents, despite their meagre income, tried their best to impart education for their children and this was possible because Al-Ameen Mission extended full support. Meritorious Aftab studied in the

Mission giving nominal fees right from class VII onwards. After getting good rank and the opportunity to study Medicine, Aftab has said that because of his father's meagre income, they had to face plenty of hardships. He could only fulfil his parent's dream because Al-Ameen Mission stood beside him firmly. This is giving him great satisfaction.

Another student has got 710 marks. He is Rizwanullah from Malda.

His All India Rank is 296. He is from Boirgacchi village under Gazole police station of Malda district. He has

NEET coaching from there. Till Madhyamik, he had studied in a residential school called Saraipath Academy. He passed the Madhyamik in 2021 with 95.29% marks and in 2023 he passed the Higher Secondary with 95.4% marks. He sat for the NEET last year scoring 500 marks. After that he took the coaching and did this outstanding result. Not only Rizwanullah, his elder sister Khadizatul Kubra too is studying Medicine. She was also a student of Al-Ameen Mission. She had studied in the Belpukur campus of the Mission. Then she studied in the Uluberia campus and took NEET coaching there. She is studying MBBS in Malda Medical College now. In 2019, they lost their father Imdadul Haque due to a motorbike accident. They have two younger brothers. Their mother Mumtaz Begum is parenting these two. out of 720 marks in the NEET. He comes from Arambagh, Hooghly. Although he has got the opportunity to study at IIT, he is opting for Medicine because of his parents' wishes. He has admitted in AIIMS Kalyani to study MBBS.

Among the girls from the Mission, Maksuda Khan comes at the third position. Her score is 690 marks—All India Rank 3269. She is from Kochiamara village under Kultali police station, South 24 Parganas. Her father Barkatullah Khan is a science graduate and works as an assistant at the Panchayet office. Her mother Hafiza Khan having passed the Madhyamik is a homemaker. Maksuda has two sisters and a brother. They are all students of Al-Ameen Mission. Maksuda is studying in the Khalatpur campus of the Mission from class VI. In

2020, she passed the Madhyamik with 93.85% marks. In 2022, her total score in the Higher Secondary was 95%. After a year of coaching, she sat for NEET in 2023 and scored 563 marks. So she had to prepare for another one more year. That resulted in this excellent result. Her elder sister Marzia Khan is in the second year of MBBS and is studying in the Calcutta National Medical College and Hospital. Marzia studied in Al-Ameen Mission from class VIII. In 2022, in NEET she had scored 615 marks and had ranked 12686. Maksuda's younger sister Karima Khan is studying at the Joynagar branch of the Mission in class X. Her brother is studying at Taldi branch in class VII. Barkatullah, their father said that although it is a bit expensive, the Mission authorities have stood beside him. So it has become a bit easy for him.

Higher Secondary (12th std.) : Success Continues

First some dry statistics. This year, in the Higher Secondary, 7 lakh 64 thousand 448 students appeared for the examination. Students passed 6 lakh 79 thousand 784— a little more than 90%. 58 students have come into the state ranking of 10. There are four Muslims among them. Last year there were eight Muslims. The Higher Secondary Council's statistics also shows that 40.92% students have secured more than 60% marks; 22.38% students secured more than 70% marks; 8.47% students secured more than 80% marks and 1.23% students secured 90% or more marks.

Two students from Al-Ameen Mission were able to sneak into the coveted state merit list. This year all total 2126 students appeared for the Higher Secondary exam – about 100 more students than last year. Among

them, 26 students secured 95% or more marks; 351 students secured 90% or more marks; 1540 students secured 80% or more marks.

Let's look at the results in percentage. 97.07% students have scored 60% or more marks; 87.83% students have scored 70% or more marks; 65.98% students scored 80% or more marks; 21.90% students have scored 90% or more marks. Comparing with the overall results it is obvious that the performance Al-Ameen's students are quite satisfying.

Md. Sahid of Nayabaz campus has come 7th in the state merit list. He has scored 490 (98%) marks. He scored 99 marks in Mathematics, Biology and Chemistry. In the Madhyamik, Sahid stood 10th in the state merit list. Then he chose Al-Ameen to continue his study. He is indeed a talented boy. Not only in Higher Secondary examination, Sahid has done well in NEET, JEE (Main and Advance) examinations. His parents Md. Khairul Alam and Salema Khatun want him to be a doctor studying in AIIMS. His sister Sahina Parvin is studying Medicine at Bardhaman Medical College.

Toufik Mamud has scored 487 marks and has stood 10th in the state merit list. He is from Kanapara village under Lalgola police station of Murshidabad. Like Sahid, Tawfik is also a very meritorious student. He has also qualified for NEET, JEE Main and Advance examina-

tions in the running year. Not only Tawfik but also his brother and sister have studied in Al-Ameen Mission. His sister is studying Nursing in a government institution and his brother Tariq Masud is studying Medicine in Prafulla Chandra Sen Medical College. Tawfik's father Abdus Sattar is a homeopathy doctor and his mother is a homemaker. Coming from a lower middle class family all the three brothers and sister have studied in Al-Ameen Mission with minimal fees.

With few notches down from Sahid and Tawfik, there are as many as 21 students in the merit list of 20. Mustaq Mamud has secured 483 marks and is ranked at 14. His village home is Gopalpur under Bhagabangola police station of Murshidabad. He is studying at the Mission from class VII. In 2022, he scored 95.71% marks in Madhyamik. Mamud wants to be a doctor.

Another meritorious student who has come in the merit list of 20 is Md. Mustafijur Rahaman. He is from Bhogoldighi village under Nalhati police station of Birbhum. He has studied in the Mission from class IX. In

2022, he scored 95.14% marks in the Madhyamik. This year in Higher Secondary he has scored 482 (96.4%) marks. He has been studying at the Khalatpur campus right from the beginning. His father Md. Morsed Ali is a primary school teacher. Mustafizur also did good scores in NEET in the running year. He wants to be a doctor.

Soleman Sk. of Gopalnagar, Kandi, Murshidabad has scored 480 marks (96%). He stands at 17th rank. He has been studying at the Dhuliyani branch of the Mission from class VI. In 2022, he scored 95.3% in the Madhyamik. His father Nisar Ali is Madhyamik passed and has worked in the Middle East for a while. Now being a diabetic patient he stays at home. He does some agricultural works. Soleman's mother Mumtaz Bibi has studied till class VIII. He has a younger brother who goes to school. The Mission had discounted fee for this meritorious student. Till Madhyamik, Soleman wanted to be an Engineer. But now he wants to be a doctor as he is not taking interest in Mathematics.

Excellent result in Madhyamik (10th std.)



This year total number of candidates have been 9 lakh 10 thousand 598. Last year, Madhyamik examinees surprisingly decreased to only 6 lakh 98 thousand 628. This year it has increased again. Among these, 4 lakh 3 thousand 900 are boys and 5 lakh 8 thousand 698 are girls. This year the percentage of passed-out candidate is 86.15%.

Students from Al-Ameen Mission got 10th position for the last two consecutive years in the state merit list. This year there are no students from the Mission in the first 10th position of the merit list but on an average, the result is satisfactory. Last year in the first 20 state list there were nine students. This year it has increased to 14 students. Students getting 90% or more have also increased. This year the number is 427 students. Overall, state-wise there are only one per cent students who have got 90% number. In view of that Al-Ameen's achievement is significant. All total 1949 students from 37 branches sat for the examination. 1286 students have passed securing 80% marks or above. Among the students, 26% (511 students) came from lower income group; 39% (759 students) came from lower-middle income group and 35% (679 students) are from middle to middle-high income group.

Sakil Ahmad who has scored 680 (97.1%) is the first among the Mission's students and ranked 14th in the state. He studied in the Belpukur campus in South Di-

najpur. He has got 99 marks in Mathematics and Life Science; 100 marks in Physical Science and Geography but perhaps he could not make his way into the first 10 rank because in English he secured 90 marks. Sakil lives in Bhagabatipur under Chanchal police station of Malda. His father Khadimul Haque is a small businessman. His mother Sahena Khatun who is a graduate is a homemaker. Sakil is studying in the Mission from class VII. His younger sister Khusbu Jahan is also studying in the Mission. Meritorious Sakil has studied giving only one fourth of the tuition fee. He wants to be a doctor in future. For that reason, he is studying at the Khalatpur campus in the science stream.

Four students have got 679 marks. They are in the 15th rank in the state. These students are Sumaiya Sultana, Maria Gore, Rupam Islam and Alif Mir. Sumaiya too gave the Madhyamik from Belpukur campus. Now she is studying in the Khalatpur campus. She is from Baikunthapur under Ratua police station of Malda. Her father is a teacher. Her favourite subject is Mathematics. She has got 99 marks in Mathematics, Life Science and Geography. Sumaiya love to play badminton. Attentive while in classroom, mock test and self-study have helped her a lot, she said.

Maria Gore lives in Chengail under Uluberia police station, Howrah. Her father Mofazzel Hossain is a government employee. Her mother Rusona Azmir Gori has done post graduate and is a homemaker. Maria's favourite subject is Life Science. She has secured cent per cent in it. Besides studying, Maria loves to draw.

Rupam Islam comes from Ahmadpur under Minakha police station, North 24 Parganas. His father Mustafizur Rahman is a teacher in a government school. His mother Rukhsana Khatun is also a post graduate but does not do any job. She is a homemaker. Rupam

Success in JEE Advance 2024

In the recently published result of JEE (Advance), Md Sahid is at the top of the Al-Ameen students. His All India Rank is 2372. He is from Nazrul Pally, Arambagh in Hooghly. Naturally, his family is happy, so does Al-Ameen Mission. Sahid's result from JEE (Main) to JEE (Advance) is fantastic. He is a topper in almost all ex-

aminations. Let's have a peek into it: JEE (Main) – 99.9 percentile number, Higher Secondary– 490 marks and ranked 7th in the state merit list, NEET – 700 marks and ranked 2332 (AIR) and JEE rank 140. It should be mentioned here that in Madhyamik, Sahid ranked 10th in the state merit list.

He has read most of the Bengali literature classics. He is also an avid reader of detective stories of Satyajit Ray and Saradindu Bandopadhyay. He also plays tabla and guitar. But all these activities he could do till class IX. After he got admitted in class XI (Science), everything stopped. Now, when he comes home from the Mission's hostel, Sahid does play with guitar or tabla sometimes.

Sahid's father Md. Khairul Anam is a veterinary doctor, mother Salema Khatun, his elder sister Sahina Parvin who is now studying medicine have given him tremendous support. He is also grateful to the guidance of the teachers of the Mission and the ideal atmosphere in the hostel to study. Although he has done brilliantly in all the JEE exams, his parents want him to study medicine from AIIMS. But Sahid wants to study Computer Science from any IIT of the country and in future involved in some advanced research work. Sahid said, from class V onwards, he used to stand first in every admission test of the Mission, but the general secretary never got him admitted. He used to say that he is always praying for my success. At last, in class XI, I got admitted in the Nayabaz campus. The superintendent of this campus Khandokar Mohiul Haque took extra care and gave me a superb atmosphere to study. This has helped me a lot.

Beside Sahid's brilliant performance, Mustak Mahmud from Gopalpur, Murshidabad who used to study in the Khalisani branch has ranked 15649. Abrar Ahmad Khan who studied in Nayabaz campus has ranked 16976. From Khalatpur campus, Md. Mehbub Alam, a boy from a peasant family in Laigola, Murshidabad has ranked

17971, from Murshidabad another student named Toufik Mamud has ranked 18340. These are brilliant results.

JEE Main Examination : Under the supervision of NTA, the results of All India JEE Main Session-1 and Session-2 were published on 12th February and 24th April respectively.

In the JEE Exam Session-1, the highest marks among the Mission students was achieved by Md. Sahid. His percentile marks is 99.89. The second highest marks went to Md. Tawfik Mamud. His percentile marks is 99.56. Among the successful candidates, there is only one girl- Anjuma Dilruba. Her percentile marks is 96.95. She wants to study Physics at IIT in future.

Other successful candidates are Danish Sugandh whose percentile marks is 99.29 and Md. Mustafijur Rahaman. His percentile marks is 99.15.

In the JEE Session-2, Toufik Mamud got the highest marks. His final percentile marks is 99.64. Danish Sugandh is in the second position with 99.29 as his percentile marks. Md. Meheboob Alam came third with 97.72 percentile marks. The fourth position among the Mission students went to Mustak Mamud of Khalisani branch. His

percentile marks is 97.64. The fifth position went to Abrar Ahmed Khan of Nayabaz branch. His percentile marks is 97.39.

West Bengal Joint Entrance Exam (Engineering) : The highest position has been achieved by Md. Sahid among the Mission students. Sahid's rank is 140 scoring 123.583 marks. The second position went to Tawfik Mamud. His rank is 177 with 118.833 as his percentile marks. The third position went to Mustak Mamud ranking 632. The fourth position went to Sarjeel Chowdhury from Khalatpur campus (rank 1412) and the fifth position went to Md. Azmaduddin of Khalisani branch (rank 1466). Besides, significant scorers are Atif Rahaman Syed (rank 2146), Moinul Hasan (rank 2544), Russel Sk. (rank 2624), Asfakullah Mondal (rank 2757), Khusru Rana (rank 2829), Wasim Ahmed (rank 2892) and many others.

Brilliant Result in English Medium

are carrying the legacy of brilliant result of their Bengali counterpart quite well. On 13th May the result came out. All total 217 students sat for CBSE 10th standard examination. Six students have scored 95% or more marks, 46 students have scored 90% or more marks, 98 students have scored 85% or more marks, 135 students have scored 80% or more marks. Those coins belonged to his mother and he mortgaged it for the sake of surviving the Mission. Hearing this, M Nurul Islam could not hold back his tears. Tears began to roll down his cheeks. The eyes of the alumni as well as the present students too welled up. It was repeated throughout the programme the struggles faced by the Mission and in particular by the founder general secretary. Those students in the initial years who saw this struggle closely

reminisced this again and again. In his speech M Nurul Islam said, I have become nostalgic today. Mention should be made in this context that in the past too, residential and non-residential coaching of Al-Ameen has yielded good re-

Admission Test for class XI

It is almost four decades since Al-Ameen Mission pioneered the concept of scientific based residential system in education, which gradually got the attention of the parents and guardians. Therefore, each year there is a phenomenal increase of students sitting for admission test. On 18 February for the academic year of 2024-25, to get admission in XI Science 4359 boys and 3415 girls appeared for the admission test from 41 centres. It is almost 500 students more than the previous year. In 30 Higher Secondary campuses spread across 15 districts, at least 2500 successful students would get admission, said the Mission management.

Like previous year, this time too significant number of students came from Malda and Murshidabad. It has been seen that the Mission has been successful although partially, to stop the erosion of talented mind. But there is long way to go as many talented students could not be



accommodated in the Mission due to lack of classroom and hostel room. Back in 1987, the Mission started its journey with only seven students, which currently has risen to 20 thousand.

Science Exhibition

In January inter-branch science and model exhibition was held in different campuses of Al-Ameen Mission. This is the fourth such exhibition of its kind. On 12th January, it was held in the North Bengal campus of Belpukur, on 14th January in Chinpai (Birbhum) and on 15th the exhibition was held at the main campus of Khalatpur. This exhibition was jointly organised by Al-

Ameen Mission and Al-Ameen Centre for Educational Research and Training (AACERT). In the Belpukur exhibition, as many as 13 branches took part. Besides exhibition, there was also science related invention competition among students. On second day of the exhibition at Chinpai, the students participated with enthusiasm. Several guests attended the programme. Partha Shaw (Assistant Teacher, Nawda Palundi High Madrasah) was the chief guest. Two judges were there; Ruhul Amin Molla (Science and Communicators Forum, Kolkata) and Syed Imtiaz Ahmed (Assistant Teacher, Margram High School). Sk Mohammad Ali

(4 August 1937 – 21 September 2024)

Mohammad Ali, the President of Al-Ameen Mission, passed away on 21st September at the age of 87 years. He has been involved with the Al-Ameen Parivar for almost 36 years. When Al-Ameen Mission began its journey from Khalatpur a nondescript village in Howrah, the organization was financially strapped. At that time, many benevolent persons extended their hands to help it out of the crisis. Ali Saheb, as he is known in the Mission Parivar, was one of them.

It was 1988-89. The founder general secretary, M Nurul Islam was plowing throughout the state to make the Mission thrive. He needed all sorts of help, financially and otherwise. At that point of time, he came in contact with Sk Mohammad Ali. Ali Saheb, one of the owners of Modern Mangala Hut of Howrah, came to Khalatpur and witnessed the intense activities of the Mission. He, along with other owners of Mangala Hut, decided to donate a lump sum of money, which helped the Mission having a tin thatched roof of the Hall room, which was under construction. Nurul Islam recounted – "We used to go to Mangala Hut every Tuesday, when it remained open. We had coupon of Rs. 5 and Rs. 10. Ali Saheb had also told many traders about us. So they used to help us. In rural areas we collected fistful of rice. Here we had coupon. In 1993, when we started constructing our first large building, Ali Saheb donated few truckloads of bricks



from his kiln. This is how he remained beside us. He was one of the big contributors in the initial stage of the Mission."

But more than that, he played a significant role as the guardian of the Mission. His guidance, consultation had hugely benefitted the institution. Mohammad Ali was an efficient businessman. "His consultation on buying plot, for instance, has helped us a lot," Nurul Islam said.

On 7th July this year, Ali Sahib visited the Mission for the last time at the New Town Campus. Inspired by Ramakrishna Mission Institute of Culture, Golpark, Al-Ameen Mission had started its journey long back. Initially it was named Institute of Islamic Culture. There was only one room at that time, Ali Sahib had seen it. From that small room to the gigantic edifice – Al-Ameen Mission Centre for Education Research and Training; a four decades long journey has come to full circle. Ali Saheb yearned to visit this too. Despite his knee pain, which used to trouble him a lot, he managed to visit it. The day he visited, teaching began in the campus. By the grace of Allah, Ali Saheb's wish was fulfilled.

In our long and arduous journey, there were many ups and downs. People came in and people went away. There was ebb and flow in the relationship with numerous persons. But Ali Saheb's relationship with us remained constant, steadfast. He bore his responsibility with utter sincerity. It is now our duty to carry forward his legacy. May Allah grant him Jannat ul Firdaus. ■

From a Rural Backyard to the

Global Map of Science

SAIKH MOHAMMAD WABAI
DUR WAS born in 27th February 1981 in Baliaghati, a village under Suti police station in Murshidabad. In the north side of the village is Shankarpur, in the south is Amuha and in the east is Nijampur. In the west lies vast stretches of land rolling into oblivion. The feeder canal of Farakka Barrage brings water for cultivation of this land. Most of the villagers earn their living through agriculture. Also bidi rolling is a good source of income in this area. Wabaidur has not seen any pucca road in the village till he was at the age of 10 years. When he was growing up, there was no electricity. A government primary school was near his house – only 400 meters away,





Everyone used to study there. It was a tin shaded mud house. There were benches though. Four teachers were there; one of them being Wabaidur's father.

Md. Tafezul Hossain, father of Wabaidur had studied till class XI, in the old syllabus it was called pre-university. After that he got the teaching job. But at that time the salary was low. But financially, he did not face any problem as he had some cultivable land. All the children of Tafezul Saheb, Wabaidur included, was very loyal. They helped their parents in whatever way they could. Wabaidur's mother Roshanara Bibi had studied till class IX. She came from a well to do family but she had no regrets. All through the day, she used to toil to keep the family running. The husband-wife duo wanted their children to be well educated. But to meet their want, they had to face many obstacles. The main obstacle was in the locality itself, against the prevailing environment.

As has been mentioned above, Wabaidur was born at the beginning of the 80s of the last century. During his growing up years in the 80s and 90s, there was no proper road in the village. It was all kutchra roads. People used to travel by horse driven carriages or simply on foot. Education was minimal. People in that area were busy running their daily chores; education was a luxurious issue for most of them. The boys, in particular, after finishing their primary schooling, go out for earning at a tender age. Some of them even went to other states. The reason was simple: abject poverty. Tafezul Hossain and Roshanara Bibi felt that their children would get sucked by this precarious situation. So they were very cautious about the education of their children. The father, in particular, kept a vigil on their studies and also kept regular touch with their teachers. Apart from his meagre salary, he used to cultivate his land for extra income. The children too helped him. But he had never thought of terminating their education. Because he continued providing his children the

much needed help, today his four sons are well established. Beside, Wabaidur, one of his brothers is a businessman, another one is a teacher in a government school and the third one works in TCS. But Wabaidur had been exceptional.

At the beginning of his schooling, he had been an average student. But

from class VI onward he gradually began to score good marks. His Bengali teacher, Swarajit Mondal inspired him quite a bit in this respect. Afterwards, when he was in class IX, a new headmaster joined the school. Bijoy Ganguly, the headmaster, too inspired him. Now, after almost 30 years, he remembers these incidents vividly. In 1996, Wabaidur passed the Madhyamik with 69.1% marks. But coming to Al-Ameen Mission changed his life entirely. Not only was his life changed, his classmate Sohel Rana's life too changed. Both of them studied from class I to V. Sohel then came to Al-Ameen Mission and studied from class VI. He is a pediatrician now. When Wabaidur passed the Madhyamik, Sohel's father Moniruddin Saheb suggested Tafezul Saheb to admit Wabaidur in the Mission. So Tafezul Saheb sent his son with his childhood friend Mofizuddin Saheb to Khalatpur. They met the general secretary M. Nurul Islam. After some deliberation, he was admitted. Wabaidur studied in the Khalatpur campus for two years paying full tuition fee.

The campus was not what it is today. Those days, watery dal, smashed potato, vegetable and rice were the staple food. Rice was served thrice a day. Fish or meat

was a rarity. Although food was ordinary the academic result was extraordinary. There were 19 students in Wabaidur's batch. 17 got first division. Moshir Rahman, now an engineer, got the highest marks among the batch with 770 marks; Sohel Rana, Wabaidur's childhood friend got 750 marks. He has become a doctor. Sarif Uddin got 745 marks and became an engineer; Golam Sarwar too became an engineer scoring 737 marks. Wabaidur scored 732 marks but in Mathematics, he scored the highest marks among his friends. He got 177 out of 200 marks.

Wabaidur was supposed to sit for the Joint Entrance but he could not. To cut the long story short, by a quirk of fate, his admit card got lost. Even he could not obtain the duplicate card amidst a strange circumstance. The money receipt remained with a fellow batch mate, which he could not take in time. Wabaidur got dejected. His brother-in-law used to live in Delhi at that time and was working at the Delhi office of the Pataka Group. He invited Wabaidur to Delhi. He went there and visited Aligarh Muslim University. But there too the admission process had ended. Wabaidur again came back and got admitted at the Berhampur Krishnath College with honours in Chemistry. After six months or so, he again got the opportunity to get admission in Aligarh. He took that opportunity and got admitted there with honours in Chemistry. The tuition fee was low, so financially there was no problem. In 2002, he passed his bachelors course and got admitted in M.Sc. (Organic Chemistry). He passed the honours with 68.3% marks. In 2004, he got his M.Sc. degree with 78% marks. At the same year, he also got qualified in N.E.T. In a way, his life was settled. Qualifying N.E.T. and after the interview, he could get a job in a college for sure. His childhood friend Hasnara Khatun, on the other hand, was waiting for him after graduation. After qualifying N.E.T. it got easier for this couple to get married. He came back from Aligarh. Although he did not get a permanent job, he was doing part time teaching assignments in D.N

College, Dhulian and Kaliachak College, Malda. But, all of a sudden, there was an unexpected turnaround in life. Life throws so many opportunities. One has to grab it or it goes abegging.

Fortunately, Wabaidur grabbed it. One of his friends from AMU, Sk. Mofiz Alam was doing PhD in South Korea. He called Wabaidur and said, "Don't waste your time. Come to Korea." So, his application for pursuing a PhD was accepted at Kyungpook National University. Wabaidur left for South Korea in 2007. A year and a half had passed, he was not getting satisfaction and was contacting many other universities. He talked to a chemistry professor from King Saud University of Saudi Arabia over phone. He was to visit Seoul, the capital city, shortly. There, Wabaidur met him and he assured him a place in the King Saud University. Meanwhile, he had already published couple of research papers. Though the Ministry of Saudi Arabia permitted him as a Researcher, the University took him as a professor. Therefore, from 2009 he has been with King Saud University as a professor and researcher as well. From 2017 to 2019 – he finished his PhD from Banasthali University, Rajasthan.

But Wabaidur has done something extraordinary. His name has been enlisted among the top 2% of scientists of the world. From 2019, U.S based Stanford University along with Elsevier BV have been collaborating to produce a list of the world's top 2% of scientists. Elsevier BV is a world's leading scientific publisher and data analytics company. They have been serving the global research and healthcare communities for more than 140 years. To prepare the list, these two institutions

meticulously go through published research papers of thousands of scientists throughout the world. Wabaidur's name has been selected thrice in this list, in 2022, 2023 and in 2024 as well. In 2023, within 22 main categories of Science with 174 sub-categories there are all total 2 lakh 10 thousand 198 scientists. In it there are 4 thousand 135 scientists of Indian origin. In 2022, Wabaidur's rank was 1lakh 66 thousand 370. In 2023, it came down to 1 lakh 23 thousand 477— down by almost 43 thousand ranks. Just a few days earlier, Stanford University has confirmed that in the sub field of Energy, Wabaidur has ranked 2847 out of 313936 authors in the current year. At present, his ranking is 1 lakh 2 thousand 762. Wabaidur's research is on the effect of Pharmaceutical drugs on a human body; identification and segregation of different biological compounds. In brief, this is what he does in his research work as he wrote me via email:

Usually, we analyse the effect of biologically important compounds and pharmaceutical drugs on human body using various analytical detection techniques. We assess inorganic ions in drinking water using new method based on chromatography-mass spectrometry. Also, we develop various methods for analysis of various pesticides to check the food quality specially the preserved food and raw vegetables. Even we determine the composition of various medicines using chromatography technique if the

ing on in the laboratory. Wabaidur is collaborating with the researchers of the King Saud University and also with different universities of the world. Some of the works have been patented; some are still waiting for patenting.

Wabaidur has written almost three hundred research papers, which have so far been published. In 2012, in one of a conference held in Belgium his works figured among top ten positions in the poster presentation category. He has already attended conferences in China, Italy and Hungary. He and his research team have done three projects funded by government and big companies.

Wabaidur has been teaching at the King Saud University beside his research work. He is satisfied with what he is doing. He wants to lead a complete family life living in Riyadh with his wife and four children. His father has passed away in 2021 while his mother died the next year. But Wabaidur is happy that his parents have seen all of their brothers in stable position.

Despite being in such an enviable position, he has not erased his past. He still remembers the role Al-Ameen Mission played in his life. In his opinion, to be successful in life, one has to seek help from others. After success comes, one should extend his hand to others. This is how a society thrives. When the general secretary of Al-

Ameen Mission M. Nurul Islam went to perform Haj last year along with his wife, Wabaidur drove all the way from Riyadh to Mecca along with his family to meet his beloved Sir. In one sense, Al-Ameen is his second home. Wabaidur put up his family in a separate hotel and took Nurul Islam and his entourage for a historical sightseeing of Mecca and Jeddah. Finally, as they took leave from each other, both of them could not hold back their tears. It was like a father parting away from his son. In a way, it actually is. ■
